If you are looking for a change of pace and an opportunity to gain valuable teaching experience, Nunavik is the place to be. The Kativik School Board is looking for teachers like you. Located in northern Québec and situated along the coasts of the Hudson and Ungava Bays, Nunavik is home to 14 Inuit communities that have much to offer you in terms of life in Nunavik. Whether you are a new grad or an experienced teacher, the Kativik School Board is a great move in your teaching career. You may even learn a few things here yourself.

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
A unique teaching experience

Teaching positions are available within our elementary and secondary schools to teach a variety of different subjects, such as Mathematics, Science, Social Science, and Physical Education, in both the English and French sectors, sometimes in a unique multi-level class setting. Second language experience is considered an asset, since a second language environment requires different teaching techniques and styles. Our schools have a gymnasium, a library, audiovisual equipment, interactive whiteboards, and Internet access, computer and science labs to help you teach the dynamic and enthusiastic children in Nunavik.

With small classroom sizes, a school year that starts mid-August and finishes up mid-June, and regular breaks in between, it's a great place to be a teacher. And, best of all, you will have a classroom immediately, no waiting list here! There is a catch: you must have, or be about to obtain, a teaching diploma or permit from a Canadian province to be considered for a position at the Kativik School Board. As well, to qualify for employment, you must have your permanent residency or be a Canadian citizen.




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A place to discover

Once you arrive in Nunavik, there will be some lifestyle changes from what you might be used to. People within the communities can speak up to three languages: Inuktitut, French and English. As well, running errands, like grocery shopping, isn't as easy and convenient. Food can be expensive and the wide variety of fresh vegetables, fruits, and meat you are used to is not always available. You will find that most of your grocery shopping will be ordered from stores in Montreal and be shipped in to where you are.

Even with all the challenges of living in Northern Québec, Nunavik provides great opportunities for a wide variety of outdoor sports and community events for you to take part in, like dog sledding, hockey, snowshoeing, and skiing. There are also opportunities to participate in indoor sports at the community arena, at the school gym and, in some communities, at the pool.



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A career with serious benefits

To help make the move to Nunavik a little easier, in addition to your regular salary, you are eligible for an annual isolation premium between \$7,800 and \$19,000, depending on the community of assignment and whether or not you have dependants. There are also up to three round-trips for teachers who work a full school year, so you can go home to visit your family, or invite a relative to your new place to show them around. With other opportunities like tax benefits, retention premiums, subsidized housing, and storage reimbursement, a teaching position at the Kativik School Board constitutes an opportunity with plenty of rewards.

It's not an easy transition, but with opportunities to gain teaching experience and fantastic benefits, it's perfect for a person with an interest in working with Aboriginal communities and a passion for teaching.
